



Comunicado Binacional Puente Internacional Guadalupe-Tornillo



January 30th, 2014.

- The Guadalupe-Tornillo International Bridge, which will span the border east of El Paso and Ciudad Juarez, will give passengers and cargo vehicles as well as pedestrians in the region a new option for international crossing.
- Construction has begun on the Mexican side of the bridge. The U.S. side of the bridge is complete and the inspection facilities are moving towards completion.
- Mexican authorities expect the bridge to be completed in July 2014. The bridge will have six lanes, three in each direction, as well as inspection facilities. Operations are expected to begin during the 2nd half of 2014.
- The Governments of the United States and Mexico are committed to the continuous improvement of the infrastructure along our common border, including the Guadalupe-Tornillo International Bridge -- a key component for the economic and social development of the El Paso-Ciudad Juarez region and of both our nations. Both governments meet regularly to discuss the operation and possible improvements to this and all shared border crossings, and have worked towards completion of this project in the spirit of strong bilateral coordination.
